*The Humane Society of Mason County is a non-profit organization providing assistance and care to displaced or abused animals including control of pet and feral cat population. Additionally, the organization is working to provide an animal shelter for unwanted companion animals.*

In 2019 we kept busy standing behind our mission statement. Our Spay and Neuter program provided financial assistance to almost 100 people in our community in getting their dog or cat fixed. Our trap-neuter-return (TNR) program assisted in getting over 80 cats and kittens spayed or neutered in an effort to keep feral cat populations in Mason County under control. We also assisted people in our community by providing food to help feed feral cats colonies.

Our foster cat and kitten program saw over 100 cats get adopted. We can't thank our Foster Cat program coordinator Hazel and our foster families enough as they volunteered their time and took these cats into their homes to provide a safe and

healthy environment for raising them until they were ready to go to their forever homes.

# Best Friends ~How To Run An Animal Shelter



## Board Member Rhonda's Certificate from Best Friends

Best Friends started in the 1980's, their mission began by a group of people who banded together to rescue animals from shelters that were about to be killed. Their mission grew and eventually expanded to the current sanctuary that now provides homes to over 1,600 animals and owns nearly 3,700 acres. Over 30,000 people visit each year and thousands volunteer. Their success has been very inspirational to those of us dedicated to animal rescue, shelter and rehoming. The Humane Society of Mason County partner's with Best Friends in an effort to continue their mission in our community. Their current goal is to end the killing of homeless animals in America's shelters by 2025.

In October, two of the board members, Lynda Haskell and myself, attended The Best Friends workshop. We spent a full week, from 8a-5p daily, either working in the classroom, listening to lectures and guest speakers, or visiting their

facilities and working with the animals. The sanctuary provides a home for dogs, cats, horses, rabbits, pigs, goats, birds, and an assortment of other animals.

Because my focus was primarily with cats, I learned how they process, evaluate and foster their cats. I also learned how they care for their neonatal kittens and a little about the Trap, Neuter and Return (TNR) program. Lynda spent time working with the dogs and visiting their horse facilities.

They had several cats that suffered from spinal injuries, Feline Leukemia, and FIV. All these cats required special care, handling, and medications. Best Friends allows these cats to be adopted, but due to their special needs, most will live out their lives being cared for by the many volunteers they have coming in each day.

They stressed the importance in getting the kittens and cats processed, examined, spayed and neutered and into foster homes, adopted or returned (in the case of the TNR) as soon as possible to reduce unneeded stress and possible exposure to other risks or possible disease.

We also learned about various structures and shelter materials, this too was very important to me, as I want

to reduce any possible construction errors when we begin our building process. I came back with a lot of information that I hope will be useful when we begin building.

They expressed the importance of working with and developing a good volunteer base. Upon my return, this was discussed with the board. Board member Chris Garder has stepped forward to work with developing our volunteers and their specific functions.

I found it amazing that the majority of their supplies are donated, this is a large organization, so to get your food, medical and cleaning supplies donated was incredible to see. I hope this is something, that as a community, we too can work towards.

Many of us on the board spend countless hours visiting shelters, taking on-line courses, working to find additional volunteers, writing grants, working with community leaders, developing our land, trapping and fostering cats and some of us hold down jobs. We are all volunteers and are passionate about working towards building a shelter in our community while still trying to provide continual support to our spay and neuter and TNR programs, to name a few. It takes all of us working together to make this happen. We want to thank our community and hope we can continue to work together to make our dream come true. Thank you.

## Spay/Neuter & TNR Updates

2019 was another busy year of spay and neuters and TNR (Trap-Neuter-Return) for the Humane Society of Mason County.

Thanks to donations that help fund our spay and neuter program, we helped cover costs for low income residents and their 96 pets. The

funds spent on this program was \$8,603.

Our TNR volunteer was also very busy last year. She helped to trap 83 feral cats for spay/neuter, helping to prevent hundreds of unwanted kittens.

## Foster, Food & Vet Programs

Our amazing Foster Care Coordinator had another busy year fostering and adopting out 102 cats and kittens.

In addition to doing many meet and greets at our office in Allyn, she also takes the adoptable fur babies to PetSmart in Lakewood where

they showcase these cuties and assist with adoptions.

One stat she doesn't share is her mileage and time driving her fosters to PetSmart and also NW Spay & Neuter in Tacoma, but we're sure it's high! Thank you Hazel for your care and time finding furever homes!

HSMC also provides pet food to Mason County residents. In 2019 we provided 1,070 lbs of food to feral cat feeders, and 999.5 lbs of food as community assistance for those needing help to keep their fur friends fed. In addition, we also helped 13 pet owners via our emergency vet fund.
